November 1, DC: Academy of Hope Site Visit

9:00AM - 11:00AM Academy of Hope offers adult education classes for those who are not able to find or retain living-wage employment. Their program offers adult literacy education, high school credentialing, and dual college enrollment; career assessment and exploration; work readiness, career certifications and work-based learning; and job search, placement and retention services.

November 7, DC: Next Step Site Visit

9:15AM - 11:15AM The Next Step serves disconnected youth with programs that increase their chances of succeeding in their post-secondary studies. Eighty percent of students have been living in the United States for less than four years. The Next Step offers these students a full academic program in English and Spanish with flexible placement and pacing, extensive and wraparound case management, life skills instruction and college and career readiness services.

November 7, Montgomery County: The Tree House Child Advocacy Site Visit

9:30AM - 10:30AM Works to address child maltreatment, including the physical abuse, sexual abuse, mental injury, or neglect of a child by a parent or caregiver. The Tree House annually provides over 850 individuals with medical evaluations, mental health assessments and treatment, nurse case management, victim advocacy and forensic interviewing in a safe, child-focused and central location.

November 7, Northern Virginia: Computer Core Site Visit

10:00AM - NOON Over a period of 8 years, Computer Core grew from a small class of five students to perennially graduating four classes - improving the lives of 48 students every six months, for a total of 96 per year. Each graduating class offered more success for students and had an even greater impact on their families and our community.

November 7, Montgomery County: Montgomery College Site Visit

10:45AM- 11:45AM Achieving Collegiate Excellence and Success (ACES) program of Montgomery College provides targeted academic coaching, interventions, and support to 1,200 students while they are enrolled in Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery College, or the Universities at Shady Grove.



November 9, Montgomery County - Community Tour of Rockville organizations providing critical safety-net services to low-income residents.

9:30AM Hearts & Homes for Youth—Empowers youth who have experienced abuse, neglect, mental health issues, homelessness, and other trauma, to make positive life choices and build brighter futures.

10:45AM Montgomery County Coalition for the Homeless—Works to end homelessness in the county by offering a wide range of supportive services and permanent and emergency housing options for 1,400 homeless and formerly homeless children and adults each year.

12:00PM Casa de Maryland—Works to improve the quality of life in immigrant communities through job placement, vocational training, instruction in English for Speakers of Other Languages, citizenship assistance, access to services and by leading grassroots community organizing efforts.

November 9, DC: Latin American Charter School Site Visit

10:00AM - NOON Career Academy offers students the chance to earn a GED, take college preparatory classes, earn college credits, and gain job skills in the high-growth healthcare and information technology sectors. One-fourth of the students are English Language Learners. Many no longer live with their parents, some have been homeless, and others have been in foster care or the juvenile justice system.

November 15, Montgomery County Community tour of organizations providing critical services for our county's senior population. *Complimentary lunch will be provided.

10:00AM Home Care Partners—Provides nonmedical, support services to low-income elderly, chronically ill and disabled residents so they can age in place.

11:30AM Arts for the Aging, Inc.—Delivers frequent, professionally led, and participatory programs, in all manners of the arts, to older adults for their health improvement and life enhancement.

12:30PM Silver Spring Village—Seeks to build and sustain a supportive network of neighbors helping neighbors remain in their own homes and be engaged in their community as they age in place.

December 1, Prince George's: House of Ruth Maryland Site Visit

2:00PM - 4:00PM House of Ruth Maryland leads the fight to end violence against women and their children by confronting the attitudes, behaviors and systems that perpetuate it, and by providing victims with the services necessary to rebuild their lives safely and free of fear.



December 5, Montgomery County: CCI Health & Wellness Services Site Visit

3:00PM - 4:00PM Connects low income, minority, and immigrant patients with holistic health care services delivered by a multilingual and diverse staff that reflects the community it serves. CCI's adolescent health services program aims to ensure positive health outcomes for teens and young adults by focusing on reproductive healthcare, integrated health services, and education.

December 6, Planned Parenthood of Metropolitan Washington Site Visit

10:00AM - 11:00 AM Provides high-quality, affordable reproductive health care to women, men and teens including reproductive health education through individual education programming, school, and community based reproductive health education workshops, and community outreach events.

December 7, Latino Economic Development Corporation Site Visit

4:00PM - 5:00PM Equips Latinos and other D.C.-area residents with the skills and tools necessary to achieve financial independence and become leaders in their communities, including a culturally and linguistically competent entrepreneurship development programming that offers technical assistance and financing.

December 9, Montgomery County: The George B. Thomas Sr. Learning Academy's Saturday School Site Visit

10:00AM - 11:00 AM Supports more than 3,000 students and their families in Montgomery County Public Schools. With 12 centers in areas with high poverty, the Saturday School works to ensure that the most academically at-risk students can access grade-appropriate, low-cost academic tutoring and mentoring services.

December 14, Northern Virginia: Arlington Free Clinic Site Visit

1:00PM - 4:00PM Arlington Free Clinic (AFC) provides free, high-quality care to low-income, uninsured Arlington County adults through the generosity of donors and volunteers. Since 1994, AFC has grown with the needs of its patients to provide comprehensive medical care in a safe and comfortable community setting.
